## City Plan Commission

March 26, 1945.

 $T_0$ the Honorable, the Common Council:

Gentlemen—We are returning, herewith, Petition No. 4319, which was submitted by Gerald F. Fitzgerald in behalf of the St. Joseph Hospital Corporation, and which was referred to this Commission for report and recommendation.

Petitioner requests that a change in Zoning District Classification in a tract of land of approximately 17 acres be made so as to permit said land to be used for a hospital site.

This land is situated on the northerly side of Moross Road between Mack and Linville Avenues.

This matter was considered at a

hearing held by the Commission on March 22, 1945, which was attended by the petitioner and some owners of land adjoining this tract. All parties of interest, as indicated by records of the City Assessors' Office, were also invited to participate in this hearing. if they desired to do so.

Petitioner presented plans showing the manner in which the premises are intended to be developed. These plans indicated the provision of ade-

quate off-street parking space.

After careful consideration of all factors involved, the City Plan Commission believes that the proposed use of the land is appropriate, and under the circumstances a change in Zoning District Classification is justiflable.

It is therefore respectfully recom-

mended that Zoning District Map No. 39 be amended to show RMU District Classification where R1 and R2 District Classification are now shown in that area bounded by Moross Road, Linville, Mack, Kingsville Avenues and the City Limits, provided the petitioner dedicates the land for cpening Kingsville Avenue 30 feet wide, as indicated in Plan No. 820-1, which is attached.

It is further recommended that any Amendment of the Zoning Ordinance, which might be made pursuant to petitioner's request be not adopted until such dedication has been made, and accepted by your Honorable

IT IS HEREBY ORDAINED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE CITY OF DETROIT: .


Section 1. That District Map 39 Ordinance No. 171-D, entitled: "An Ordinance to establish districts in the City of Detroit; to regulate the use of land and structures therein; to regulate and limit the height, the area, the bulk and location of buildings; to regulate and restrict the location of trades and industries and the location of buildings designed for specified uses; to regulate and determine the area of yards, courts and other open spaces; to regulate the density of population; to provide for the administration and enforcement of this ordinance; to provide for a Board of Appeals, and its powers and duties; and to provide a penalty for the violation of the terms there-, as amended, be and the same is hereby amended as follows:
