

Dr. Thomas K. Gruber, Superintendent, Wayne County General Hospital, Chairman, Sister Ann, Providence Hospital, and Dr. Claire H. Carpenter, Assistant Director, Grace Hospital, North Branch, was named by the Detroit Hospital Council to discuss this matter with your Committee. Several conferences were held and the Detroit Hospital Committee recently submitted the attached report as a result of their study. The report was adopted in principle by the Detroit Hospital Council and a new Committee, comprised of Mr. Willis Gray, Business Manager of the Jennings Hospital, Chairman, Dr. E. Dwight Barnet, Superintendent of Harper Hospital, and Dr. Claire H. Carpenter, Superintendent of Grace Hospital, North Branch, was named by Mr. Robert Gohagen, President of the Detroit Hospital Council.

The writer met with the last named Committee on Wednesday morning, March 19th, at which time the following specific items were discussed.

1. Zone the City of Detroit.
2. Select a representative number of hospitals to care for emergency cases within the respective zones.
3. The emergency hospitals selected must be adequately staffed to render a twenty-four hour service. (Define what is meant by a hospital being adequately staffed.)
4. Visiting Staff doctors must be available and House Officers must be on continuous call twenty-four hours daily for serious emergencies.
5. A method mutually satisfactory to the City of Detroit and the co-operating hospitals for subsidizing patients must be worked out.
6. Rate of payment to attending staff doctors for giving services must be agreed upon. (Fees to the attending physician or surgeon probably should be the same as those now paid to hospitals for Michigan Medical Service.)

At the conclusion of this meeting, the Detroit Hospital Council Committee assured me that their work will be completed in approximately one month, at which time it is hoped that a proposal for the solution of this problem can be presented to your Honorable Body.

In the meantime, another conference to be held with your Ambulance Committee will be scheduled in approximately two weeks.
