It now appears that the campaign for funds for buildings for the Medical Science Center must be postponed for an indefinite period; at the same time, emergency demands for capital funds for site development, build-ings, alterations, and equipment at the main campus are such that the President of Wayne University indicates this reserve fund should be used for these immediate and urgent capital cost requirements. This action the more imperative, he declares, since no capital cost appropriation was provided in the 1946-1947 budget, and the one included in the 1947-1948 budget request will be inadequate to meet the critical needs.
