To the Honorable, the Common Council:

Gentlemen—Letters have been addressed to your Honorable Body on August 20, 1945, March 1, 1946, August 13, 1946, and December 15, 1947, requesting the City of Detroit to deed to the Board of Education tax-foreclosed property known as Lot C, 590 feet by 100 feet, located on the West side of Lemay Avenue, between Charlevoix and Goethe, to be used as additional land for the Southeastern High and Foch Intermediate Athletic Field.

The Board of Education has issued a quit claim deed to the City of Detroit for the necessary turn-arounds on Lemay Avenue, granting easements, etc.

I have been informed by the City Controller that the resolution adopted by your Honorable Body on August 5, 1947 (p. 2074) does not provide for deeding this portion of land to the Board of Education. As soon as the necessary resolution has been

adopted by your Honorable Body and the deed executed by the proper city officials, the Board of Education will proceed with the necessary improvements to make this much needed land available for athletic purposes.

To the Honorable, the Common Council:

Gentlemen—It has been necessary to rearrange the outlines of a number of election precincts to equalize the voting population therein. These changes resulted in the alteration of 784 precinct outlines and the creation of 157 new precincts, making a total
