To the Honorable, the Common  
Council:

Gentlemen—The Election Commis-  
sion today completed a spot check  
to verify the authenticity of signatures  
of those electors who participated in  
the April 4, 1949 Election through a  
comparison of their signatures on the  
applications for ballots with that  
appearing on their registration rec-  
ords.

One precinct from each of the  
twenty-two wards was chosen at  
random. From these, 3,651 signatures
