Gentlemen-There is returned herewith the petition of Walter T. Frontczak et al (1370), requesting condemnation or elimination of property included in the St. Clair playfield extension.

This site, which is included in the Master Plan of Recreation, is a builtup area which will probably not be acquired for some time. It is anticipated that many of the vacant sites not yet in public ownership will be given an earlier priority.

In view of the above circumstances, it is the recommendation of Commission that the site in question be retained on the Plan, but that the requirement for review of building permits which was adopted by your Honorable Body be rescinded, insofar as this site is concerned.

The Department of Parks and Recreation has concurred in this recommendation.
