 Recreation which offers to dedicate
 land, from a playground site, for the
 widening of Stout and Trojan Avenues
 at the intersection of these two streets.

Our investigation discloses that the
 land necessary to widen the above
 mentioned streets is under the jurisdic-
 tion of the Department of Parks
