# COMMON COUNCIL

(REGULAR SESSION)

Detroit, Tuesday, November 21, 1950

The Council met and was called to order by the President, Hon. Louis C. Miriani.

Present—Councilmen Beck, Connor, Garlick, Kronk, Oakman, Rogell, Smith, Van Antwerp, and the President—9.

There being a quorum present the Council was declared to be in session. The journal of the preceding session was approved.

## Taken from the Table

Councilman Kronk moved to take from the table an ordinance designating a new thoroughfare south of and parallel to Chalfonte ave. between Manor and Montevista, extended, and between Pinehurst and Mendota, extended, to be known as Hillview ave., laid on the table Nov. 14, 1950 (J.C.C. p. 3192), which motion prevailed.

The Ordinance was then placed on the order of third reading.

## THIRD READING OF ORDINANCE.

The title to the ordinance was read a third time.

The ordinance was then read.

The question being "Shall this ordinance now pass?" The ordinance was passed, a majority of the councilmen present voting therefor as follows:

Yeas—Councilmen Beck, Connor, Garlick, Kronk, Oakman, Rogell, Smith, and Van Antwerp—8.

C. C. p. 3180), which motion prevailed.

### From the Mayor

Honorable Common Council:

Gentlemen—I am returning herewith the resolution adopted by your Honorable Body, November 14, 1950, and which calls for the vacating of alleys bounded by Brace, Penrod, West Chicago and Fitzpatrick Avenues; and, also the alley lying westerly of Fitzpatrick Avenue and parallel thereto, between Brace and Penrod Avenues.

I disapprove of this resolution for reasons previously stated, relative to multiple dwellings in what is generally termed as single home areas. I have visited this area on three occasions and am of the belief that the project which this resolution would permit would not be beneficial to the property and home-owners already located there.
