To the Honorable, the Common Council:

Gentlemen—On Friday, March 3, 1950, this department received a requisition for Fifteen (15) carloads of Coal which the Tennessee Valley Authority offered to ship to the City of Detroit. This was required to replace, in part, the coal furnished by others that were entirely out of coal.

We issued a telegraphic authorization to ship and the coal was en route before word was received that the strike was ended.

We respectfully request permission to write a purchase order covering approximately 900 tons of 1- $\frac{1}{4}$ in. to 0 in. Bituminous Coal at \$6.61, f. o. b. Spring City, Tennessee, which carries a freight rate of \$4.00 to the Public Lighting Commission Plant at Detroit.
