Gentlemen—The members Mayor's Committee for the Rehabilitation of Narcotic Addicts are unanimously agreed that the employment of a full time executive secretary is an immediate necessity if our studies are to move forward with the greatest efficiency and without unnecessary

To the end that an individual of desirable personal and professional qualifications be retained and mindful of the fact that permanent employment cannot be provided, we feel that a salary at an annual rate of \$8,500.00 should be offered. further suggest that sufficient funds be allocated at the present time to defray the necessary committee ex-penses for a period of one calendar vear.

The committee therefore respectfully requests that effective as of June 15, 1951, \$8,500.00 for the salary of the executive secretary and \$500.00 for stationery and supplies, postage and travel expenses be provided from available funds.
