## City Plan Commission

August 28, 1952.

Honorable Common Council:

Gentlemen-The City Plan Commission has received a request from the Department of Parks and Recreation to widen Minneapolis Avenue to a width of 50 ft. between Cadieux and Bluehill Avenues.

Investigation discloses that all of the land necessary to effect this widening, with the exception of westerly 111.71 ft., is under the jurisdiction of the Department of the Parks and Recreation. The Department of Parks and Recreation, in their request, indicated a willingness to provide sufficient land to create a right of way width of only 50 ft. for Minneapolis Avenue. However, our studies indicate that this street will receive more use than the average residential street because of the fact that it serves as a means of ingress and egress to the William L. Messmer Playground and therefore should have a minimum width of not less than 60 ft. The Department of Parks and Recreation have agreed to this increase in width.

The land necessary to complete the widening of the westerly 111.71 ft. of Minneapolis Avenue is privately owned and is vacant. It will be necessary to acquire this property by condemnation.

After careful consideration of all the factors involved it is the opinion of the City Plan Commission that the widening of Minneapolis Avenue between the east line of Cadieux Avenue (76 ft. wide) and the west line of Bluehill Avenue (60 ft. wide) would be a necessary and beneficial public improvement. It is therefore recommended that land be condemned to widen the westerly 111.71 ft. of Minneapolis Avenue to a width of 60 ft. and that sufficient land be allocated from the William L. Messmer Playground to widen the remaining portion of this street to the same with.
