Gentlemen—In response to our advertisement for proposals for furnishing this Department with One (1) 6 in. Water Meter, in accordance with specifications on file in this office, three bids were received and opened March 31, 1953, as shown on the attached tabulation. Inquiries were forwarded to eleven companies.

It is recommended that the second low bid, submitted by Hersey Manufacturing Company, be accepted, wherein they agree to furnish this meter for the sum of \$1,092.00, f.o.b. Woodward Terminal, Highland Park, Michigan.

The second low bid is being recommended inasmuch as it is essential that the meter be installed at the earliest possible date and the second low bidder can furnish the meter within 30 days, whereas the low bidder, Worthington Corporation, will require 90 days for delivery. Streets and Traffic

March 25, 1953.

Honorable Common Council:
Gentlemen—Paragraph B, Section 10, Ordinance 689-E charges the Streets and Traffic Commission with the regulation of the issuance of permits for various activities involving work in or under public streets, boulevards, alleys and the like. There are several activities for which permits are required which are not included in this section. After consultation and discussion with the Department of Public Works and the Department of Buildings and Safety Engineering, it has been agreed upon by these two departments and this Department to recommend the amendment of this section of the ordinance to include regulation of issuance of permits for the erection of sidewalk canopies, projecting advertising signs, the operation of buildings used exclusively for washing automobiles, building construction and demolition where any part of the public street is used and construction of spur tracks crossing public property.

We, therefore, recommend that Paragraph B, Section 10, Ordinance 689-E be amended to read (additions to paragraph indicated by capital letters):

"Regulates the issuance of permits through rules, regulations and examinations, for the making of excavations in or under streets, boulevards, alleys, public squares or places, and the like, the laying therein of pipes, wires, cables, conduits, and the like, the erection of all poles in said streets, boulevards, alleys, public squares or places, THE ERECTION OF SIDEWALK CANOPIES AND PROJECTING ADVERTISING SIGNS, THE OPERATION OF BUILDINGS USED
