City Plan Commission

February 4, 1954.

Honorable Common Council:

Gentlemen—The City Plan Commission has received a communication from the Department of Parks and Recreation offering to set aside a portion of a playfield site between Southfield and Rutland Avenues south of Diversey Avenue and north of the Ruddiman School to serve as street and alley outlets.

At the present time the area to the north of the playfield is subdivided with streets and alleys dead-ending at the north boundary of the playfield. The land offered by the Department of Parks and Recreation will provide a 40-foot wide connecting street between Archdale and Longacre Avenues and two 20-foot wide alley outlets for the N/S alleys to the east and west of these two streets.

The Department of Streets and Traffic and all other interested City departments have been contacted and there are no objections to the proposal.

After careful consideration of all

the factors involved it is the recommendation of the City Plan Commission that a 40-foot wide strip of land be allocated from the northerly side of the above described playfield to serve as a connecting street between Archdale and Longacre Avenues and also a 20-foot wide strip of land, to the east and west of the proposed new connecting street, to serve as outlets for the N/S alleys in this area. It is further recommended that the new 40-foot wide E/W street be named Sawyer Avenue and that any costs in improving or paving these streets or alleys be borne by the Department of Parks and Recreation.

All the above being shown on the attached plan No. SS-117.

City Plan Commission

Honorable Common Council:

Gentlemen—Pursuant to your request, the City Plan Commission has reviewed certain riverfront properties for the purpose of determining their best usage and possible future need for any public purposes. The Departments to whom these properties have been assigned have also been consulted relative to their plans for further use of the properties. The parcels of land involved are:

Parcel 1—The southwest corner of Riopelle and Atwater, comprising approximately 5 acres of land with a measurement of 424.43 feet on the waterfront and extending back a distance of 519.63 feet along Riopelle Avenue to Atwater Street. This parcel is now unassigned to any department with the exception of portions of two properties comprised of approximately .75 acres that have been assigned to and are being used by the Department of Parks and Recreation and the Public Lighting Commission.

Parcel 2—This parcel is located at the southwest corner of Atwater and
