Gentlemen—This is in reply to your directive of May 16, 1955, requesting information as to what is being done or what will be done to improve traffic conditions at the Livernois exit of the

Edsel Ford Expressway.

On May 24, 1955, this matter was forwarded to the attention of the State Highway Department for submission to the Engineering Subcommittee. On August 3, 1955, we forwarded to all members of the Expressway Engineering Subcommittee, suggested plan revisions at the Livernois Interchange as prepared by the Department of Streets and Traffic. On September 1, 1955, the Engineering Subcommittee considered this matter and recommended that an east bound "off" ramp be constructed from the Edsel Ford Expressway to surface level at Livernois Avenue, immediately west of the Livernois Avenue Bridge. This matter was approved in view of the fact that traffic counts indicate a heavy movement in this direction. It is our understanding that the State Highway Department will include this construction at an early date.

Regarding the construction of a west bound "off" ramp to Livernois Avenue, the Committee agreed that in view of the light traffic movements in that direction, this construction could be deferred until a greater need is

shown.
