Detroit water system only for make-up water to replace water lost by evaporation or by flushing of the equipment, and

c. Which uses an average of less than 12 gal. of water from the De-troit water system per hour per ton of cooling capacity when the unit is

operating, and

d. Which has no piping connection allow operation of the air-conditioning unit by direct use of water from the Detroit water system either in conjunction with or in place of such cooling tower, atmospheric con-denser, spray pond, or other recircu-lating and heat-exchanging equip-ment, except as provided for in Sec-tion 9 hereof.

12. The suburban water rate schedule shall be amended to include an air-conditioning demand charge at the city rate plus the regular suburban surcharge of five per cent (5%), and all the rules, regulations and definitions stated herein are to apply equally to all suburban customers; and further, all suburban customers shall be required under appropriate provisions of current contracts, provide this Department with all the data required to enable it to bill and collect said demand charge from said suburban customers. By Councilman Wise:
