Dear Mr. Leadbetter:

In response to your letter of September 4, we are sending the attached "Two-Year Program for Federal Assistance" for the information of the Common Council.

Our initial application for these urban planning assistance funds from the Federal Housing and Home Finance Agency was made in November, 1956. There have been several amendments to our application since, but the attached document is a fairly complete perspective of the work which we expect to achieve under this Federal grant in a two-year program. As you probably understand, these are matching funds. The \$138,000 will be provided by the Federal government in steps and will be matched out of our regular budget, which comes from the Region's counties, over the two-year project period.

The program outlined here is the kind of work we have been engaged in and will continue to work on as time goes on. In other words, the Federal grant does not support a new program but simply speeds up and expands our basic program in doing planning work for the metropolitan area. Our staff will be expanded for this two-year period and the various projects outlined will be
