Honorable Common Council:

Gentlemen—As requested by the Committee of the Whole of the Common Council, we have the following to report on the communication from the Mayor's Rehabilitation Committee request for approval of the agreement with the Michigan State Board of Alcoholism for the fiscal year 1960-61.

The appropriation for operation and maintenance of the Mayor's Rehabilitation Committee for 1960-61 was provided in the amount of \$53,624 with an estimated State grant in the amount of \$14,501. The revenue was estimated on the basis of the contract with the Michigan State Board of Alcoholism for the year 1959-60 in the amount of \$12,791, (J.C.C. 10-27-59 page 2175), which provided for reimbursement of the cost of two rehabilitation counselors assigned to work at the Detroit House of Correction.

Prior to July 1960, in allocating their appropriation of \$160,000 throughout the State for 1960-61, the
