Gentlemen — We wish to advise that in carrying out the development plan for the rehabilitation of the blighted area known as the Central Business District No. 3 which is being undertaken by the City of Detroit, it will be necessary to relocate Congress Street between St. Antoine Street and the Walter P. Chrysler Expressway.

The Housing Commission is anxious to complete the relocation of said Congress Street in the above mentioned project and has been advised by the City Engineer's Office that the contract for the paving of new Congress Street has been let and it will be necessary for land to be allocated for the relocation of said street.

In view of the foregoing, it will be necessary to adopt the attached resolution allocating the necessary land to relocate Congress 70 feet wide between St. Antoine Street and the Walter P. Chrysler Expressway.

Resolved, That all that part of the following described Tract "A", lying within a strip of land which lies 35.00 feet each side of and measured perpendicular or radially thereto of the following described centerline of Congress Street relocation.

The centerline of Congress Street relocation is described as follows:

Beginning at a point in the centerline of Congress Street 60 feet wide, said point being measured south, 59 degrees, 53 minutes, 03 seconds west, a distance of 24.67 feet from the intersection of the centerline of Congress Street 60 feet wide with the centerline of St. Antoine Street 50 feet wide;

Thence along the arc of a tangent curve to the right, whose radius is 465.00 feet with a central angle of 37 degrees 27 minutes 00 seconds, a distance of 303.94 feet to a point of tangency;

Thence south 82 degrees 39 minutes 57 seconds east, a distance of 104.02 feet to a point of curvature;

Thence along the arc of a tangent curve to the left, whose radius is 465.00 feet with a central angle of 37 degrees 30 minutes 00 seconds, a distance of 304.34 feet to the point of ending of this centerline.
