Gentlemen—Contract PW-3090 is for Rerouting Lateral Sewer 7032 in Alley and R/W North of Hancock from 14th to 15th. George A. Odien is the Contractor. The Contract does not provide for partial payment and as the balance of the work consists of the replacement of street and alley pavement, when weather conditions permit, the Contractor has requested partial payment.

The total value of the work fully completed and found acceptable under the terms and conditions of the Contract is \$14,440.00, and it is recommended that authority be granted to pay that amount less a retained amount of \$2,000.00, making a net payment of \$12,440.00. The Contractor has submitted an affidavit that all labor, material, and other indebtedness in connection with the work has been paid.

The \$2,000.00 to be retained is in excess of the estimated value of the uncompleted work.

Honorable Common Council:

Gentlemen—We are returning herewith the petition of the Riley Land Company, No. 9284, requesting the vacation of certain alleys in the block bounded by Helen, East Grand Boulevard, Gratiot and Warren Avenues. The vacation of said alleys was approved by the City Plan Commission, with the recommendation that the petitioner dedicate land for a

new alley outlet into Helen Avenue. The petition was then referred to this office by our Committee of the Whole for investigation and report.

We wish to advise that our investigations are completed.

As per our directive the petitioner paid into the City Treasury the sum of \$166.67, Receipt No. B-36050, credited to the Street Maintenance Division of the Department of Public Works Fund Code No. 143-6241, said amount being the original cost of paving the east one-half of Helen Avenue at the intersection of the alley to be vacated.

The petitioner also deposited with the Permit Division of the Department of Public Works the sum of \$4,000.00, Receipt No. GR-5852, said amount being the estimated cost of removing the paved alley return at the entrance of the alley to be vacated, constructing straight curb and sidewalk incident to such removal, construct new alley return at the entrance to the newly deeded alley, and pave the newly deeded alley.

Proper provisos are incorporated into the vacating resolution protecting the City's interests in the sewers located in the alleys to be vacated.

All other City departments and privately owned utility companies reported that they will be unaffected by the vacation of said alleys or that they have reached satisfactory agreements with the petitioner regarding their installations therein.

We recommend the adoption of the attached resolution.

Resolved, That all that part of the north-south public alley, 15 feet wide, south of Warren Avenue and east of and parallel to Helen Avenue, as platted in Brewer's Subdivision of the South 24 Acres of the West 30 acres of P.C. 678, lying north of Gratiot Avenue, City of Detroit, Wayne County Michigan, as recorded in Liber 11, Page 71 of Plats, Wayne County Records, lying east of and adjoining the east line of lots 16 to 20 both inclusive, east of and adjoining the east line of the north 19.38 feet of lot 15, east of and adjoining the east line of the south 10 feet of lot 21, west of and adjoining the west line of lot 28, west of and adjoining the west line of the south 40 feet of lot 24 and west of and adjoining the west line of the 20-foot vacated alley lying between lot 28 and lot 24, all of the above mentioned subdivision;

Also, all that part of the public alley 20 feet wide, east of Helen Avenue and north of and parallel to Gratiot Avenue as platted in the above mentioned Brewer's Subdivi-

sion, as recorded in Liber 11, Page 71 of Plats, Wayne County Records, lying north of and adjoining the north line of lots 10 to 13 both inclusive, south of and adjoining the south line of lot 28, south of and adjoining the south line of south-easterly 17.32 feet of lot 15 and south of and adjoining the south line of the 15-foot public alley lying between lot 15 and lot 28, all of the above mentioned subdivision;

Also, all that part of the north-south public alley, 20 feet wide, west of East Grand Boulevard and south of Warren Avenue as platted in above mentioned Brewer's Subdivision, as recorded in Liber 11, Page 71 of Plats, Wayne County Records, lying east of and adjoining the east line of lot 28 and east of and adjoining the east line of the 20-foot vacated alley lying north of said lot 28, all of the above mentioned subdivision;

Also, all of the east-west public alley, 20 feet wide, north of Gratiot Avenue and east of Helen Avenue as platted in the amended plat of lots 1 to 9 inclusive, and lot 14 in Block 1 of Brewer's Subdivision of the south 24 acres of the west 30 acres of P.C. 678, lying north of Gratiot Avenue, City of Detroit, Wayne County, Michigan, as recorded in Liber 16, Page 81 of Plats, Wayne County Records, lying north of and adjoining the north line of lots 6 to 9 both inclusive, north of and adjoining the north line of the east 13.31 feet of lot 5, all of above mentioned subdivision, and south of and adjoining the south line of the west 86.33 feet of lot 15 of the previously mentioned Brewer's Subdivision, as recorded in Liber 11, Page 71 of Plats, Wayne County Records;

Be and the same are hereby vacated as public alleys to become a part and parcel of the adjoining property subject to the following provisions:

1) Provided, That by reason of the vacation of the above described alleys, the City of Detroit does not waive any rights to the sewer located therein and at all times shall have the right to enter upon the premises, if found necessary, on account of said sewer to repair, alter or service same; and further

2) Provided, That if a building is to be constructed over said sewer, the sewer shall be replaced with cast iron pipe of the same size, rerouted or encased in 6 inches of Class "A" concrete, or in lieu of the above, such work shall be done as will be specified by the City Engineer, all of the work mentioned to be done under the supervision and inspection of the Department of Public Works and all costs entailed to be borne by the petitioners, their successors, or assigns; and further

3) Provided, That no buildings shall be constructed over said sewer with-

out the prior approval of such building constructed by the City Engineer and the Department of Buildings and Safety Engineering; and further

4) Provided, That in the event that the sewer located in said alleys, if built upon, shall break causing damage to any construction above, the petitioner and their assigns by acceptance of the permit for building over said sewer, waive all claims for damages to such construction and agree to pay all costs incident to the repair of said broken sewer; and further

Provided, That the Riley Land Company deed to the City of Detroit the following described parcel of land: "the north 20 feet of Lot 21 of Brewer's Subdivision of the South 24 Acres of the west 30 acres of P.C. 678 lying north of Gratiot Avenue, City of Detroit, Wayne County, Michigan, as recorded in Liber 11, Page 71 of Plats, Wayne County Records", said land to be used for a new alley outlet into Helen Avenue.
