Re: Rental of Field Office Kiefer-Ford Conservation Project.

Gentlemen—Due to the increase in project activities and the addition of the Well-Being project for the aged to the services offered in the Kiefer-Ford Project it is necessary to seek larger field office quarters.

Two adjoining vacant stores, at 8513 and 8517 John C. Lodge, are available for rental. These two stores are favorably located for our purposes being near the center of the project. The two stores offer a combined floor space of approximately 2700 sq. ft. We would plan to connect by an interior archway.

At present we rent two small stores totaling approximately 900 square feet of floor space at 1111 and 1117 Seward for a rental of \$85.00 per month on a month to month basis.

We, therefore, request approval of your Honorable Body for the negotiation of a Lease with Miss Lillian Jablway of 20161 Meyers for the space as outlined above at a rental of \$100 per month. Further we request approval of your honorable body to terminate the present lease in effect for the premises at 1111 and 1117 Seward.
