Detroit-Wayne Joint Building Authority

Honorable Detroit Common Council:

Gentlemen—The Detroit-Wayne Joint Building Authority has made application to the Housing and Home Finance Agency for an advance of funds to aid in financing the preparation of plans for the construction of a Recorder's Court Building to be located in the block bounded by Gratiot, St. Antoine, Clinton and Raynor Streets.

In order to expedite the approval of this financing, it is necessary that the Joint Building Authority show ownership of the complete site, or an option to purchase same.

The site contains 72,744 sq. ft. all of which is presently owned by the City of Detroit in fee simple, with the exception of a small parcel containing 1,106 sq. ft. which is now under condemnation in the Recorder's Court. The condemnation proceedings are scheduled for completion within the next sixty (60) days.

We, therefore, request the City Controller be authorized to execute an option agreeing to convey the property to the Authority upon payment of the appraised value, after the City completes the acquisition of the northwest corner of St. Antoine and Clinton.
