a wide range of Federal and private funds. The second will be knowledgeable about foundation monies, and the third will lend expertise in the area of Federal monies.

We would like to hire Miss Jenny Lind as the first of the three consultants. The other two will be designated at a later date. Miss Lind is Acting Chief, Community Services Section, Division for Children and Youth. Wisconsin State Department of Public Welfare. She brings with her thirty years of experience in government and private agencies. In her present position, she is responsible for the planning of multiple state and county programs which utilize funds from all possible sources.
