

city by vessel, before the same shall be offered for sale shall be subject to the inspection of the Inspector of Firewood of the Northern or Southern District, as the case may be, and in case of a refusal of the person or persons in charge of said wood to have said wood inspected, and to pay to the Inspector his lawful fees when demanded for such inspection, he or they shall be liable to the pains and penalties as provided in section 13 of said chapter 18.

SEC. 17. This ordinance shall take immediate effect.

ALLEY IN SEVENTH WARD.

Resolution for opening an alley in block between Riopelle street and Orleans, Clinton street and Macomb, in the Seventh Ward, 20 feet in width.

Be it resolved by the Common Council of the city of Detroit, State of Michigan, that it is necessary to make the following described public improvement in said city, to-wit: To open an alley in block between Riopelle street and Orleans, Clinton street and Macomb, in the Seventh Ward, 20 feet in width.

And the said Common Council do hereby declare that they intend to take and use for the purpose of making said improvement, the following described property, viz: Ten feet, more or less, off the northerly ends of lots 1, 2, 3, 4 and 5, north of and adjoining Macomb street, on the Dequindre farm; ten feet, more or less, off the southerly end of lots 16, 17, 8, 19 and 20, south of and adjoining Clinton street, on the Dequindre farm; ten feet, more or less, off the northerly end of lots 124, 125 and 126, north of and adjoining Macomb street, on the Riopelle farm; ten feet, more or less, off the southerly end of lots 13, 134 and 135, south of and adjoining Clinton street, on the Riopelle farm.

And the said Common Council do further declare that they will, on the fourth Monday of October, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and sixty-eight, at the hour of 9 o'clock in the forenoon of that day, apply to the Recorder's Court, at the court-room of said Court, of said city, for the drawing and impanelling of a jury to ascertain the necessity for using the property above described as intended to be taken and used for the purpose of making said improvement, and to ascertain the just damages and compensation to which any person may be entitled if said improvement be made.

And to apportion and assess such damages and compensation to and upon all lots, premises and subdivisions thereof, which will be benefited by such improvement.

And the City Clerk of said city is hereby directed to cause this resolution to be published for four (4) successive weeks before said fourth Monday of October, A. D. 1868, in the Detroit Daily Advertiser and Tribune, the official daily newspaper of said city, and the Michigan Daily Volksblatt, another daily newspaper published in said city.

And the Superintendent of Police of said city is hereby directed, by himself or by one of the captains or sergeants of police under his direction, to serve notices of this resolution on the persons and in the manner prescribed in section three of chapter seven of the charter of said city.
