Resolved, That the Department of Public Works be and it is hereby authorized and directed to issue permits to the following petitioners to close on a temporary basis the corresponding streets:

Michigan Department of State Highways to close on a temporary basis: Modern Street under the I-75 Freeway west of Riopelle Street;

Detroit-Wayne Joint Building Authority to close on a temporary basis: Raynor Street between Clinton and Gratiot;

Provided, That no building or other structure is constructed in said streets; that petitioner shall observe the rules and regulations of the Department of Public Works, and further subject to the following provisions:

The City of Detroit retains all rights and interests in the area herein temporarily closed;

The City and all utility companies retain their rights to establish, maintain, and service any utilities in said area of temporarily closed street, and further

Provided, That at the expiration of said permit, all obstructions therein shall be removed at the expense of the grantee, and the public property affected shall be restored to a condition satisfactory to the Department of Public Works, by and at the permittee's expense, and further

Provided, This resolution is revocable at the will, whim or caprice of the Common Council, and further, that grantee acquires no implied or other privileges hereunder, not expressly stated herein.

Re: Acceptance of the Deed from Mobil Oil Corporation for land in the DSR Site at Warren and the Chrysler Freeway.

Land in the City of Detroit, County of Wayne being parts of Lots 84 and 83 of "George Hendrie's Subdivision of O.L. 191 and North 452.32 feet of O.L. 190, Rivard Farm" as recorded in Liber 10, Page 91 of Plats, W.C.R. and being more particularly described as follows: beginning at the northeast corner of lot 83, thence southerly along the easterly line of lot 83, 40.00 feet to a point; thence northwesterly 56.56 feet to the north line of lot 84; thence easterly along said north line, 40.00 feet to the place of beginning containing 800 square feet, more or less, also part of the South 1/2 of vacated Theodore Street adjacent to the aforementioned land, described as beginning at a point on the north line of the said lot 84, five feet (5 ft.) west of the northeast corner of said lot; thence northerly parallel to the east line of lot 84, 25.00 feet to the center line of Theodore Street; thence westerly along said center line 25.00 feet to a point; thence southeasterly 35.35 feet to the point of beginning containing 313 square feet, more or less.

Subject: Reallocation of a position of Storekeeper to Senior Storekeeper
