

This project was originally financed under the Federal-aid TOPICS program. The TOPICS program has since been discontinued under the 1973 Federal Highway Act and the State has expended or committed its share of remaining TOPICS funds, making it necessary to reprogram the construction of these projects under the Federal-aid Urban Systems program with the Federal-aid increased from 50 under TOPICS to 70 under Federal-aid Urban funding.

This proposed amendment to Agreement 73-0184 therefore changes both the source and percentage of the Federal participation in the cost of constructing these improvements and revises the cost estimates based on the latest information. The participation is now estimated as follows:

EAST OUTER DRIVE—VAN DYKE
 Design Engineering and Survey (TOPICS Funds)
 City, \$12,500; Federal-aid (50), \$12,500. Total \$25,000.

Construction including Field Engineering and City Force Account Work (Urban Funds).

City, \$10,210; Wayne County Road Commission, \$162,590; Federal-Aid (70), \$403,200; Total, \$576,000.

EAST OUTER DRIVE—EAST SEVEN MILE.

Design Engineering and Survey (TOPICS Funds).
 City, \$12,500; Federal-Aid (50), \$12,500; Total, \$25,000.

Construction including Field Engineering and City Force Account Work, (Urban Funds).

City, \$48,320; Wayne County Road Commission, \$101,680; Total, \$500,000.

This agreement has been reviewed by the Corporation Council and approved as to form. Because of the importance of proceeding with these projects for the safety and convenience of the public, we recommend adoption of the following resolution which approves the amendment to the agreement, authorizes the Street Administrator to execute it in behalf of the City and authorizes the Controller to revise the accounts in accordance with the latest estimate of cost.

Land in the City of Detroit, County of Wayne, Michigan, being part of P.C. 729, also part of Lot 31 of "Whitwood and Vernor Subdivision of a part of P.C.'s 727 and 729 lying south of Michigan Avenue," as recorded in
