Resolved, That the Department of Public Works be and it is hereby authorized and directed to issue permit to the Detroit Bank to maintain the present "T" shaped footings encroaching on public property at the northwest corner of Grand River and W. Warren Aves. until such time as said building is rebuilt or remodeled, at which time all encroachments are to be removed.
