By Councilman Van Antwerp:

Resolved, That the Department of Public Works be and it is hereby authorized and directed to issue permit to the Federal Works Agency, Public Buildings Administration, to construct electric service ducts with manholes for 4600 volt electric service in Marantette Avenue approximately 43' west of 14th Street from the U. S.

Parcel Post Building (now designated as the Roosevelt Park Annex, Post Office), thence easterly approximately 126' crossing 14th Street, then south approximately 313' between the walk and building into the proposed new U. S. Post Office garage. Said ducts to be at least 3' under the top grade of the pavement of Marantette Ave. and 14th Street.

Provided, That said work shall be performed under the supervision of the Department of Public Works and the Public Lighting Commission and in accordance with plans submitted and approved by said departments, and further

Provided, That no rights in the public streets, alleys or other public places shall be considered waived by this permission, which is granted expressly on the condition that said electric service ducts and manholes and all obstructions in connection therewith shall be removed at the expense of the grantee at any time when so directed by the Common Council, and that the public property affected shall be restored to a condition satisfactory to said Department by said grantee at its expense; and further

Provided, That said permit issued by the Department of Public Works is granted with the distinct understanding that in the event of the charter of the City of Detroit being amended in such manner as will provide for the levying of a fee, charge or rental, to be hereafter determined upon, or in the event of an ordinance or resolution being enacted providing for an annual charge or rental for the occupancy of public streets, alleys or other public places, that the grantee will pay said fee, charge or rental provided for in said charter, or ordinance or resolution, and that said grantee does hereby bind himself thereunto and to accept said permit on the conditions hereby imposed, and in the event of the said grantee contesting the validity of said charter amendment, ordinance or resolution or of said fee, charge or rental, or upon refusal to pay same, this permit shall immediately become void; and further

Provided, This resolution is revocable at the will, whim or caprice of the Common Council and grantee hereby expressly waives any right to claim damages or compensation for property constructed hereunder or for the removal of same, and further, that grantee acquires no implied or other privileges hereunder not expressly stated herein.
