Alley Opening

To the Honorable, the Common Council:

Gentlemen—To your Committee of the Whole was referred petition of the Taxpayers Association of North Detroit, et al. (1954), protesting against the use of property on McNichols Road between Syracuse and Mound Aves. for cemetery purposes, and requesting the acquisition of the land by the City of Detroit for public purposes. After several hearings with petitioners, and conferences with the Corporation Counsel, your committee believes that the acquisition of an alley at the rear of the property on the east side of Syracuse Ave. will provide some relief for the owners, and we therefore recommend that the Corporation Counsel be instructed to prepare the proper resolution for the condemnation of an alley east of Syracuse Ave. from the alley south of McNichols Road to Luce Ave., provided the owners on Syracuse Ave. deposit with the City Treasurer, as an evidence of good faith, a sufficient amount of money to cover the cost of condemnation of the land for alley purposes.
