By Councilman Castator:

Resolved, That the Dept. of Public Works be and it is hereby authorized and directed to issue permit to the Transit and Storage Company, to install an eight inch pipe line in connection with its system for the transportation of crude oil and petroleum, from the west side of Five Points ave., south of Fargo, diagonally across Five Points ave. in a northerly direction across Fargo ave., Norfolk ave. and diagonally across Salem ave., thence across Shiawassee ave. and the Eight Mile Rd., and intervening alleys or easements.

Provided, That said pipe line shall be installed at such depth below the grade of said streets as directed by the Dept. of Public Works, and that the work shall be performed under the supervision of, and in accordance with plans submitted to and approved by that department, and further

Provided, That no rights in the public streets, alleys or other public places shall be considered waived by this permission, which is granted expressly on the condition that said pipe line and all obstructions in connection therewith shall be removed at the expense of the grantee at any time when so directed by the Common Council, and that the public property affected shall be restored to a condition satisfactory to said Department by said grantee at its expense, and further

Provided, That said permit issued by the Dept. of Public Works is granted with the distinct understanding that in the event of the charter of the City of Detroit being amended in such manner as will provide for the levying of a fee, charge or rental, to be hereafter determined upon, or in the event of an ordinance

or resolution being enacted providing for an annual charge or rental for the occupancy of public streets, alleys or other public places, that the grantee will pay said fee, charge or rental provided for in said charter, or ordinance or resolution, and that said grantee does hereby bind himself thereunto and to accept said permit on the conditions hereby imposed, and in the event of the said grantee contesting the validity of said charter amendment, ordinance or resolution or of said fee, charge or rental, or upon refusal to pay same, this permit shall immediately become void, and further

Provided, This resolution is revocable at the will, whim or caprice of the Common Council and grantee hereby expressly waives any right to claim damages or compensation for property constructed hereunder or for the removal of same, and further, that grantee acquires no implied or other privileges hereunder not expressly stated herein.
