Permits

To the Honorable, the Common Council:

Gentlemen—To your Committee of the Whole was referred petition of the Detroit Edison Co. (5684), to install an underground electric transmission line across property of the Charles Terrace Project near the N. E. corner of Buffalo and Talbot Aves. After consultation with the Detroit Housing Commission and the Public Lighting Commission, and careful consideration of the request, your committee recommends that same be granted in accordance with the following resolution.

By Councilman Oakman:

Resolved, That the Detroit Housing Commission be and it is hereby authorized and directed to issue permit to the Detroit Edison Co., to install an underground 138 KV electric transmission line encased in 8-5/8 in. steel pipe, across property of the Charles Terrace Project, near the N. E. corner of Buffalo and Talbot Aves., and to be located 4 ft. minimum below grade.

Provided, That said work shall be performed at grantee's expense, under the supervision of the Housing Commission and the Public Lighting Commission, and in accordance with plans submitted to and approved by said departments, and further

Provided, That no rights in the public property, streets, alleys or other public places shall be considered waived by this permission, which is granted expressly on the condition

that said electric transmission line and all obstructions in connection therewith shall be removed at the expense of the grantee at any time when so directed by the Common Council, and that the public property affected shall be restored to a condition satisfactory to said Department by said grantee at its expense, and further

Provided, That said permit issued by the Detroit Housing Commission is granted with the distinct understanding that in the event of the charter of the City of Detroit being amended in such manner as will provide for the levying of a fee, charge or rental, to be hereafter determined upon, or in the event of an ordinance or resolution being enacted providing for an annual charge or rental for the occupancy of public streets, alleys or other public places, that the grantee will pay said fee, charge or rental provided for in said charter, or ordinance or resolution, and that said grantee does hereby bind himself thereunto and to accept said permit on the conditions hereby imposed, and in the event of the said grantee contesting the validity of said charter amendment, ordinance or resolution or of said fee, charge or rental, or upon refusal to pay same, this permit shall immediately become void, and further

Provided, This resolution is revocable at the will, whim or caprice of the Common Council and grantee hereby expressly waives any right to claim damages or compensation for property constructed hereunder or for the removal of same, and further, that grantee acquires no implied or other privileges hereunder not expressly stated herein.
