Gentlemen—Attached is a report prepared by the Controllers' Survey & Systems Bureau containing details of our recommendation on our off-street

parking program.

It covers our initial proposal with details on estimated costs and anticipated revenues, and schedules showing how the facilities will be financed. Because the program is new and the report comprehensive, we felt it best to submit to you a few days in advance of our presentation of the gov-erning ordinance. This will give you an opportunity to review it prior to our request for formal action.

The report represents the combined
