After consultation with the Dept. of Public Works, and careful consideration of the requests, your committee recommends that same be granted in accordance with the following resolution.

Resolved, That the Dept. of Public Works be and it is hereby authorized and directed to issue permits to the following to encroach beyond the property line upon public property to the extent indicated, at the locations mentioned, and maintain such encroachments during the life of the buildings;

Frazer Paint Co., to install new plywood front on existing masonry building at 3901 Fenkell Ave. between Holmur and Quincy, described as Lots 165 and 166, Dexter Park Sub.; said new plywood to encroach approximately 1½ ins. beyond the property line into Fenkell Ave., for a distance of 40 ft. width of the building.

Frank Serresque, to maintain building at 15435 W. Seven Mile Road between Greenfield and Prest, described as lots 1401 to 1403, incl., Blackstone Park Sub. No. 2, with a macotta front encroaching $1\frac{1}{8}$ ins. tapering down to $1\frac{1}{8}$ in. beyond the property line into Seven Mile Rd., for a distance of 39.94 ft. width of the building.

Provided, That same shall be maintained under the rules and regulations of the Dept. of Public Works and the Dept. of Buildings & Safety Engineering, and in accordance with plans submitted to and approved by said departments, and further

Provided, That at any time said buildings are remodeled, rebuilt or otherwise changed, they are placed on the proper lot lines with no encroachment on public property, and further

Provided, That this resolution is revocable at the will, whim or caprice of the Common Council, and grantees hereby expressly waive any right to claim damages or compensation for property constructed and maintained hereunder, or for the removal of same, and further, that grantees acquire no implied or other privileges hereunder, not expressly stated herein.
