Resolved, That the Dept. of Public Works be and it is hereby authorized and directed to issue permit to Church of the Precious Blood, to make the following installations, to provide such services to its new church:

To install two, 4 in. fibre conduits for electric service, underground and across Verne Ave. at a point approximately 136 ft. east of Hartwell Ave.; provided said conduit lines are encased in concrete at least 3 ft. below the top grade of the street, and the work is performed under the supervision of the Dept. of Public Works, Dept. of Buildings & Safety Engineering, and the Public Lighting Commission, in accordance with plans submitted to and approved by those departments.

To install a 16 in. conduit containing a 6 in. steam supply, and a 2 1/2

in. steam return lines; same to be installed underground at least 3 ft. below the top grade of the street, across Grove Ave. at a point approximately 292 ft. west of Littlefield, provided the work is performed under the supervision of the Dept. of Public Works and the Dept. of Buildings & Safety Engineering, in accordance with plans submitted to and approved by those departments, and further

Provided, That no rights in the public streets, alleys or other public places shall be considered waived by this permission, which is granted expressly on the condition that said utility lines, and all obstructions in connection therewith shall be removed at the expense of the grantee at any time when so directed by the Common Council, and that the public property affected shall be restored to a condition satisfactory to said Department by said grantee at its expense, and further

Provided, That said permit issued by the Department of Public Works, is granted with the distinct understanding that in the event of the Charter of the City of Detroit being amended in such manner as will provide for the levying of a fee, charge or rental, to be hereafter determined upon, or in the event of an ordinance or resolution being enacted providing for an annual charge or rental for the occupancy of public streets, alleys or other public places, that the grantee will pay said fee, charge or rental provided for in said Charter, or ordinance or resolution, and that said grantee does hereby bind himself thereunto and to accept said permit on the conditions hereby imposed, and in the event of the said grantee contesting the validity of said Charter amendment, ordinance or resolution or of said fee, charge or rental, or upon refusal to pay same, this permit shall immediately become void, and further
