To the Honorable, the Common Council:
Gentlemen:

The Board of Education petitions your Honorable Body for necessary authority to permit the Fogo Electric Company, electrical contractors for the construction of the Marquette School, to proceed with proposed underground work across Canyon Avenue. This work will consist of encasing fire alarm and telephone service conduits in concrete below the surface of the street, in accordance with the requirements of the Department of Public Works and subject to their inspection and approval.

The attached drawing indicates the route of the required conduits.

By Councilman Rogell:

Resolved, That the Dept. of Public Works be and it is hereby authorized and directed to issue permit to the

Board of Education to install a three-inch conduit for fire alarm and telephone service lines, underground and across Canyon Ave., approximately 71 ft. east of the center line of Molina St., to service the Marquette School on the south side of Canyon Ave. between Berden and Molina.

Provided, Said conduit is encased in concrete at least 3 ft. below the top grade of the street, and that all work shall be performed under the supervision of the Dept. of Public Works, Dept. of Buildings & Safety Engineering, and the Public Lighting Commission, and in accordance with plans submitted to and approved by said departments, and further

Provided, That no rights in the public streets, alleys or other public places shall be considered waived by this permission, which is granted expressly on the condition that said utility lines conduit and all obstructions in connection therewith shall be removed at the expense of the grantee at any time when so directed by the Common Council, and that the public property affected shall be restored to a condition satisfactory to said Department by said grantee at its expense, and further

Provided, That said permit issued by the Department of Public Works, is granted with the distinct understanding that in the event of the Charter of the City of Detroit being amended in such manner as will provide for the levying of a fee, charge or rental, to be hereafter determined upon, or in the event of an ordinance or resolution being enacted providing for an annual charge or rental for the occupancy of public streets, alleys or other public places, that the grantee will pay said fee, charge or rental provided for in said Charter, or ordinance or resolution, and that said grantee does hereby bind himself thereunto and to accept said permit on the conditions hereby imposed, and in the event of the said grantee contesting the validity of said Charter amendment, ordinance or resolution or of said fee, charge or rental, or upon refusal to pay same, this permit shall immediately become void, and further

Provided, This resolution is revocable at the will, whim or caprice of the Common Council and grantee hereby expressly waives any right to claim damages or compensation for property constructed hereunder or for the removal of same, and further that grantee acquires no implied or other privileges hereunder not expressly stated herein.
