### Encroachments

Gentlemen—To your Committee of the Whole were referred petitions of Arrow Liqueurs Corp. (8199), to maintain a garbage chute projecting in alley at 3539 Concord Ave., and Glenn Motor Sales, Inc. (8343), for building encroachment, 15860 Grand River. Resolved, That the Dept. of Public Works be and it is hereby authorized and directed to issue permits to the following to encroach beyond the property line to the extent indicated, and maintain such encroachments during the life of the buildings at the locations mentioned:

Arrow Liqueurs Corp., to maintain a 30 in. diameter metal garbage chute encroaching in alley from the rear of building at 3539 Concord Ave. between Mack and Benson Aves., extending on said building from the second floor to the garbage receptacle on the ground, provided same shall always be maintained in good condition and not create a nuisance.

Glenn Motor Sales, Inc., to install new porcelain enamel facing on both the Prevost and Grand River Ave. sides of building at 15860 Grand River Ave., whereby the existing columns, seven on Grand River and two on Prevost Ave., presently encroaching approximately one-half inch beyond the property line, into said streets will be increased by one inch, making a total encroachment of one and one-half inches at a height of 24 in. at each column.

Provided, That same shall be maintained under the rules and regulations of the Dept. of Public Works and the Dept. of Buildings & Safety Engineering, and in accordance with plans submitted to and approved by said departments, and further

Provided, That at any time said buildings are remodeled, rebuilt or otherwise changed, they are placed on the proper lot lines with no encroachment upon public property, and further

Provided, That grantees accept such

permission with the distinct understanding that they assume full responsibility for any and all claims or damages which may arise by reason of the granting of said permits, and further

Provided, That this resolution is revocable at the will, whim or caprice of the Common Council, and grantees hereby expressly waive any right to claim damages or compensation for property constructed and maintained hereunder or for the removal of same, and further, that grantees acquire no implied or other privileges hereunder, not expressly stated herein.
