Gentlemen—To your Committee of the Whole were referred petitions of the Board of Education (3070), to install telephone conduits across alley and Cass Ave. between Putnam and Warren; Goebel Brewing Co. et al (3095), for a utility lines tunnel across Maple St. between Gratiot and Rivard, and Aurora Gasoline Co. (3175), to install pipe lines in alley from Powell to River Rouge. After consultation with the Dept. of Public Works, and careful consideration of the requests, your committee recommends that same be granted in accordance with the following resolution.

By Councilman Beck:

Resolved, That the Dept. of Public Works be and it is hereby authorized and directed to issue permits mentioned to the following:

Board of Education (3070), to install underground conduits across Cass Ave. from the Wayne University Student Center to manhole in north and south alley, west of Cass Ave. and north of Warren Ave., to provide telephone service for the student center building, provided same is installed at least 3 ft. below the top grade of the street.

Goebel Brewing Co. et al (3095), to construct a tunnel for light, power, steam and chilled water lines across Maple St. between Gratiot and Rivard, at a point approx. 110 ft. west of Rivard, from its boiler room in property on the south side of Maple St. to its office facilities on the north side of Maple St., provided it is constructed at least 3 ft. below the top grade of the street, and further provided that the relocation of any utility lines necessary during construction of said tunnel shall be borne by petitioner.

Aurora Gasoline Co. (3175), to extend a 10 in. oil pipe line and a 12

in. oil pipe line in 9 ft. public alley between Powell Ave. and River Rouge, a distance of approximately 75 ft., provided said lines are installed at least 3 ft. below top grade of the alley, provided petitioner shall furnish a rider to be approved by the Corporation Counsel, to include and make applicable these additional lines in existing surety bond in the amount of \$10,000.00 filed pursuant to resolutions of Nov. 21st, 1939 (JCC p. 2687), May 4th, 1948 (JCC p. 1211), and May 8, 1951 (JCC p. 1003-4), saving and protecting the City of Detroit harmless from any and all claims, damages or expenses that may arise by reason of the issuance of said permit, and providing for the faithful performance by the grantee of the terms hereof, and further, that if the Commissioner of Public Works of the City of Detroit deems the amount of said bond inadequate at any time he may demand a bond in an amount which he believes will sufficiently protect the City's interests, and that grantee shall not assign or transfer any right that it may have hereunder without the consent of the City of Detroit.

Provided, That said work shall be performed under the supervision of the Department of Public Works and in accordance with plans submitted to and approved by said department, and also the Dept. of Streets & Traffic as may be required in any of said matters, and further

Provided, That no rights in the public streets, alleys or other public places shall be considered waived by this permission, which is granted expressly on the condition that said utility lines, tunnel and all obstructions in connection therewith shall be removed at the expense of the grantee at any time when so directed by the Common Council, and that the public property affected shall be restored to a condition satisfactory to said Department by said grantee at its expense, and further

Provided, That said permit issued by the Department of Public Works is granted with the distinct understanding that in the event of the Charter of the City of Detroit being amended in such manner as will provide for the levying of a fee, charge or rental, to be hereafter determined upon, or in the event of an ordinance or resolution being enacted providing for an annual charge or rental for the occupancy of public streets, alleys or other public places, that the grantee will pay said fee, charge or rental provided for in said Charter, or ordinance or resolution, and that said grantee does hereby bind himself thereunto and to accept said permit on the conditions hereby imposed, and in the event of the said grantee contesting the validity of said Charter amendment, ordinance or resolution or of said fee,

charge or rental, or upon refusal to pay same, this permit shall immediately become void, and further

Provided, This resolution is revocable at the will, whim or caprice of the Common Council and grantee hereby expressly waives any right to claim damages or compensation for property constructed hereunder or for the removal of same, and further, that grantee acquires no implied or other privileges hereunder not expressly stated herein.
