Schmidt, to maintain one-story brick commercial building on lots 49 and 50, B. E. Taylor's Rain-bow Sub., at 17701 W. McNichols Rd., corner of Archdale, with wood cornice 11½ ft. above sidewalk grade encroaching 4 inches tapering down to 3½ inches beyond the property line into Archdale Ave., for a distance of 20 ft. length of cornice, and maintain such encroachment for the life of the building under the rules and regulations of the Dept. of Public Works and the Dept. of Buildings & Safety Engineering, and in accordance with plans submitted to and approved by said departments, and further

Provided, That at any time said building is remodeled, rebuilt or otherwise changed it is placed on the proper lot lines with no encroachment upon public property, and further

Provided, That grantees for their heirs and assigns, accept such permission on the conditions hereby imposed and with the further distinct understanding of assuming full responsibility for any and all claims or damages which may arise by reason of the granting of said permit, and further

Provided, That this resolution is revocable at the will, whim or caprice of the Common Council and grantees hereby expressly waive any right to claim damages or compensation for property constructed and maintained hereunder or for the removal of same, and further, that grantees acquire no implied or other privileges hereunder not expressly stated herein.
