By Councilman Lincoln:

Resolved, That the Dept. of Public Works be and it is hereby authorized and directed to issue permit to the Chrysler Corp. (731), to construct a structural steel framework for utility lines through their tunnel or so-called underground bridge beneath E. Vernor Hwy., east of Conner Lane,

servicing their plants on both sides of the street, subject to petitioner first filing an endorsement to surety bond No. 7908163 on file with the City Controller, to include the addition of said proposed structural steel framework, saving and protecting the City of Detroit harmless from any and all claims, damages or expenses that may arise by reason of the issuance of additional permit herein granted and providing for the faithful performance by the grantee of the terms hereof, and further

Resolved, That the Dept. of Public Works be and it is hereby authorized and directed to issue permit to Wayne State University (730), to install a telephone conduit line across Ferry, Palmer, Colburn (Ford Expressway Service Drive), Antoinette and Cass Aves., in accordance with requirements of the Dept. of Streets & Traffic, pertaining to either tunnelling or open cutting of certain streets as necessary, to effectively connect telephone stations in other buildings of the University with the Administration Building at 5900-5940 Cass and 5901 Woodward, subject to petitioner first filing with the City Controller an approved surety bond in the penal sum of \$10,000.00, saving and protecting the City of Detroit harmless from any and all claims, damages or expenses that may arise by reason of the issuance of said permit and providing for the faithful performance by the grantee of the terms hereof.

Provided, That said work shall be performed under the rules and regulations of the Dept. of Public Works, Public Lighting Commission, Dept. of Buildings & Safety Engineering, Water Board and the Dept. of Streets & Traffic insofar as same applies to each department, and in accordance with plans approved by the departments concerned, and further

Provided, That no rights in the public streets, alleys or other public places shall be considered waived by this permission, which is granted expressly on the condition that said utilities, and all obstructions in connection therewith shall be removed at the expense of the grantee at any time when so directed by the Common Council, and that the public property affected shall be restored to a condition satisfactory to said Department by said grantee at its expense, and further

Provided, That said permit issued by the Department of Public Works is granted with the distinct understanding that in the event of the Charter of the City of Detroit being amended in such manner as will provide for the levying of a fee, charge or rental, to be hereafter determined upon, or in the event of an ordinance or resolution being enacted providing for an annual charge or rental for the

occupancy of public streets, alleys or other public places, that the grantee will pay said fee, charge or rental provided for in said Charter, or ordinance or resolution, and that said grantee does hereby bind himself thereunto and to accept said permit on the conditions hereby imposed, and in the event of the said grantee contesting the validity of said Charter amendment, ordinance or resolution or of said fee, charge or rental, or upon refusal to pay same, this permit shall immediately become void; and further

Provided, This resolution is revocable at the will, whim or caprice of the Common Council and grantee hereby expressly waives any right to claim damages or compensation for property constructed hereunder or for the removal of same, and further, that grantee acquires no implied or other privileges hereunder not expressly stated herein.
