

Permits

Honorable Common Council:

Gentlemen—To your Committee of the Whole was referred petition of the University of Detroit (4767), to install a television coaxial cable in alleys from their studio, 3800 Puritan Ave. After careful consideration of joint report from the Departments of Public Works, Streets & Traffic, and Public Lighting Commission, your committee recommends that same be granted in accordance with the following resolution.

By Councilman Carey:

Resolved, That the Dept. of Public Works be and it is hereby authorized and directed to issue permit to the University of Detroit to install and maintain a television coaxial cable buried in a transite conduit underground and crossing the east-west alley north of Puritan and extending along the north/south alley between Dexter and Holmur, beginning at the intersection of said alleys from the rear of their television studio at 3800 Puritan to University of Detroit property 300 ft. north of Puritan.

Provided, Said cable is installed at least three feet below the top grade of the alley, and the work is performed under the supervision of the Dept. of Public Works, Buildings & Safety Engineering and the Public Lighting Commission, and in accordance with plans submitted to and approved by said departments; also that during the construction period, petitioner shall provide traffic safety measures as required by the Dept. of Streets & Traffic, and further

Provided, Petitioner shall first file with the City Controller an approved surety bond in the penal sum of \$10,000.00, saving and protecting the City of Detroit harmless from any and all claims, damages or expenses that may arise by reason of the issuance of said permit, and providing for the faithful performance by the grantee of the terms hereof, and further

Provided, That no rights in the public streets, alleys or other public places shall be considered waived by this permission, which is granted expressly on the condition that said coaxial cable and all obstructions in connection therewith shall be removed at the expense of the grantee at any time when so directed by the Common Council, and that the public property affected shall be restored to a condition satisfactory to said Department by said grantee at its expense, and further

Provided, That said permit issued by the Department of Public Works is granted with the distinct

understanding that in the event of the Charter of the City of Detroit being amended in such manner as will provide for the levying of a fee, charge or rental, to be hereafter determined upon, or in the event of an ordinance or resolution being enacted providing for an annual charge or rental for the occupancy of public streets, alleys or other public places, that the grantee will pay said fee, charge or rental provided for in said Charter, or ordinance or resolution, and that said grantee does hereby bind himself thereunto and to accept said permit on the conditions hereby imposed, and in the event of the said grantee contesting the validity of said Charter amendment, ordinance or resolution or of said fee, charge or rental, or upon refusal to pay same, this permit shall immediately become void, and further

Provided, This resolution is revocable at the will, whim or caprice of the Common Council and grantee hereby expressly waives any right to claim damages or compensation for property constructed hereunder or for the removal of same, and further that grantee acquires no implied or other privileges hereunder not expressly stated herein.
