Resolved, That the Dept. of Public Works be and it is hereby authorized and directed to issue permit to Russell Dalzen, to maintain building on property described as Lots 1 thru 6 Paterson Bros. & Co's. Ridgemont Sub., commonly known as 16094 E. Eight Mile Road, encroaching beyond the property line into public property from 0.75 ft. at the east end to 1.29 ft. at the west end, for a distance of 60 ft. along the street, and also to maintain a fence encroachment east of the building extending into public property from 1.21 ft. at the east end to 1.25 ft. at the west end for a distance of 68.3 ft. along the street on the south side of E.
