Resolved, That the Department of Public Works be and it is hereby authorized and directed to issue permit to Majestic Development Company, owner of property known as 30 East Willis and to Photography Center, tenant of said premises, to use an asphalt paved area of public property between the sidewalk and property line, approximately 23 feet deep by 45 feet along said street for parking purposes in connection with their adjacent customer parking lot, provided petitioner installs precast curbing or other approved barrier one

foot behind the sidewalk and also replaces any posts which extend from the end of the building to the sidewalk in order to contain this parking to the allocated area.

Provided, That petitioner's property shall be subject to any tax which may be levied pursuant to law with regard to such use of public property, and further

Provided, That permittees shall first furnish an agreement in form approved by the Corporation Counsel, saving and protecting the City of Detroit harmless from any and all claims, damages or expenses that may arise by reason of the issuance of said permit, and providing for the faithful performance of the permittees of the terms hereunder, and file same with the City Controller, and further

Provided, That said permit shall be issued only after a certified copy of this resolution has been duly recorded in the office of the Wayne County Register of Deeds, by and at the permittee's expense; and further

Provided, That such use of said public property shall be made under the rules and regulations of the Department of Public Works and the Department of Streets and Traffic in accordance with plans submitted to and approved by those departments and the City Plan Commission, and further

Provided, That no rights in the public streets, alleys or other public places shall be considered waived by this permission, which is granted expressly on the condition that said area of public property and all obstructions in connection therewith shall be removed at the expense of the grantee at any time when so directed by the Common Council, and that the public property affected shall be restored to a condition satisfactory to said Department by said grantee at its expense, and further

Provided, That said permit issued by the Department of Public Works is granted with the distinct understanding that in the event of the Charter of the City of Detroit being amended in such manner as will provide for the levying of a fee, charge or rental, to be hereafter determined upon, or in the event of an ordinance or resolution being enacted providing for an annual charge or rental for the occupancy of public streets, alleys or other public places, that the grantee will pay said fee, charge or rental provided for in said Charter, or ordinance or resolution, and that said grantee does hereby bind himself thereunto and to accept said permit on the conditions hereby imposed, and in the event of the said grantee contesting the validity of said Charter amendment, ordinance or resolution or of said fee, charge or rental, or upon re-

fusal to pay same, this permit shall immediately become void, and further

Provided, This resolution is revocable at the will, whim or caprice of the Common Council and grantee hereby expressly waives any right to claim damages or compensation for property constructed hereunder or for the removal of same, and further that grantee acquires no implied or other privileges hereunder not expressly stated herein.
