By Councilman Wierzbicki:

Resolved, That the Department of Public Works be and it is hereby authorized and directed to issue a permit to Koenig Fuel and Supply Company, a Michigan corporation, at 500 E. Seven Mile Road, for an encroachment into public property on the south side of E. Seven Mile Road, Detroit, Michigan, the property being described as:

"Part of N.W. ¼ of N.W. ¼ of Section 12, T.1S., R.11E., C of D, Wayne County, Michigan."

The encroachment is to consist of field stone and transite panels, encroaching a maximum of 6 inches, placed on front of existing building for a distance of 146 ft. 6 in. and to a maximum height of 20 ft. 4 in.

Provided, That the necessary permit be obtained from the Department of Public Works and that same shall be constructed and maintained under the rules and regulations of the Department of Public Works and the Department of Buildings and Safety Engineering; and

Provided, That permittee at the time of obtaining said permit file with the City Controller an indemnity agreement in form approved by the Corporation Counsel, saving and protecting the City of Detroit harmless from any and all claims, damages or expenses that may arise by reason of the issuance of said permit and the faithful performance by the permittee of the terms thereof, and in addition, to pay all claims, damages or expenses that may arise out of the maintenance of said permission; and

Provided, That permittee shall be subject to any tax which may be levied against it pursuant to law with regard to such use of public property; and

Provided, That this resolution is revocable at the will, whim or caprice of the Common Council and permittee hereby expressly waives any right to claim damages or compensation for property constructed hereunder or for the removal of same, and further, that permittee acquires no implied or other privileges hereunder not expressly stated herein; and

Provided, That no rights in the public streets, alleys or other public places shall be considered waived by this permission, which is granted expressly on the condition that said encroachment and all obstructions in connection therewith shall be removed at the expense of the permittee at any time when so directed by the Common Council; or at such time as the permittee shall vacate the premises or change the use of the premises, and that the public property affected shall be restored to a condition satisfactory to said Departments by said permittee at his expense; and

Provided, That this permit shall not be assigned or transferred without the written approval of the Common Council; and

Provided, That the filing of the indemnity agreement and the securing of the necessary permit referred to herein shall be construed as acceptance of the terms of this resolution by the permittee; and

Provided, That a certified copy of this resolution shall be recorded with the office of the Register of Deeds for Wayne County by and at permittee's expense.
