Resolved, That the Department of Buildings and Safety Engineering be and it is hereby authorized and directed to issue permit to the J. L. Hudson Company, a Michigan Corporation, to erect an awning for the Wellington Jewels store on the Washington Boulevard side of the

David Whitney Building, Detroit, Michigan, in accordance with recommendations of the departments involved (Ord. 42-1-5). The encroachment consists of a metal frame and canvas awning, approximately six (6') feet by twelve (12') feet for the purpose of identifying the shop location.

Provided, That the necessary permit be obtained from the Department of Buildings and Safety Engineering and that same shall be maintained under its rules and regulations and in accordance with plans submitted to and approved by it and the Departments of Parks and Recreation and City Planning Commission; and

Provided, That no rights in the public streets, alleys or other public places shall be considered waived by this resolution, which resolution is adopted expressly on condition that said encroachment shall be removed at the expense of the permittee at any time when so directed by resolution of the Common Council, and that the public property affected shall be restored to a condition satisfactory to said Department of Buildings and Safety Engineering by said permittee at its sole cost and expense; and

Provided, That this resolution is revocable at the will, whim or caprice of the Common Council, and permittee hereby expressly waives any right to claim damages or compensation for removal of encroachment, and further, that permittee acquire no implied or other privileges hereunder not expressly stated herein; and

Provided, That the securing of the necessary permit referred to herein shall be construed as acceptance of the terms of this resolution by the permittee; and

Provided, That this permit shall not be assigned or transferred without the written approval of the Common Council.
