Returning herewith petition of Michigan Bell Telephone Company (5864) requesting permission to encroach at the northwest corner of Houston (15263) and Kelly Road.

Michigan Bell Telephone Company is a lessee, the owner being the Estate of Frances S. Frazer, Detroit Bank and Trust Company, Account 31523. Therefore, the petition should be in the names of both owner and lessee.

The property is legally described as: Ward, 21, Item 57418, all that part of the rear concession of Private Claim 231 described as: Beginning at the intersection of the northerly line of Houston Avenue, 103 feet wide, and the northwesterly line of Kelly Road, 93 feet wide, thence along the northerly line of Houston Avenue on a course 89 D 40 M 40 S west 118 feet to a point; thence north 00 D 31 M 10 S. west 139.24 feet to a point; thence south 59 D 58 M 10 S east 173.11 feet to a point on the northwesterly line of Kelly Road; thence along the northwesterly line of Kelly Road on a course south 30 D 01 M 50 S. west 61.16 feet to the place of beginning.

The encroachment will consist of cedar siding applied to the facade to encroach approximately 5/8 inch onto public property for a distance of 36' 10" along Houston and for a distance of 61' 2" along Kelly Road at a height of 23 feet.

Whereas, The City Council has appointed Dr. George Gullen of Wayne State University, or his designee, as ad hoc members of the Historic Designation Advisory Board by resolution passed June 15, 1977 (J.C.C. 1325-26) in order to represent ownership of the Blackman-Mackenzie House, the house at 80 West Palmer, and the Campbell-Symington House, all under study for possible historic designation, and

Whereas, The Campbell-Symington House, located at 3977 Second, is no longer owned by Wayne State University, having been sold to Mr. William Marsh, and

Whereas, The Ordinance for Establishment of Historic Districts (161-H) requires that the owner be represented as an ad hoc member of the Historic Designation Advisory Board when a single structure is being considered for designation.

Now, Therefore, Be It Resolved, that the City Council removes Dr. George Gullen, or his designee, as an ad hoc member of the Historic Designation Advisory Board with respect only to the Campbell-Symington House at 3977 Second Avenue, and

Be It Further Resolved, that the City Council appoints Mr. William Marsh to ad hoc membership on the Historic Designation Advisory Board in connection with the study of the Campbell-Symington House at 3977 Second Avenue for possible designation as an historic district.
