ALLEY IN THE SIXTH WARD.

Resolution to vacate, abolish and close all that certain alley running into alley north of Fremont street, and between Woodward avenue and John R street, in the Sixth Ward.

Be it resolved by the Common Council of the city of Detroit, State of Michigan, that it is necessary to make the following public improvement in said city, to wit: To vacate, abolish and close all that part of a public alley situated on park lot 31, bounded as follows: Commencing at the southeasterly corner of lot 1, of Fisher's and Shearer's subdivision of park lots 30 and 31, on the northerly side of Fremont street, and running thence north 30 degrees west 171 10-100 feet; thence north 60 degrees east 15 feet; thence south 30 degrees east 171 10-100 feet; thence south 60 degrees west 15 feet to the place of beginning, in the Sixth Ward of said city.

And the said Common Council do hereby declare that they will, on the first Monday in August, in the year of our Lord 1868, at the hour of 9 o'clock in the forenoon of that day, apply to the Recorder's Court, at the court-room of said court, in said city, for the drawing and impanneling of a jury to ascertain the necessity to vacate, abolish and close all that certain alley running into alley north of Fremont street, and between Woodward avenue and John R street, as aforesaid.

And the City Clerk of said city is hereby directed to cause this resolution to be published for four (4) successive weeks before said first Monday of August, A. D. 1868, in the DETROIT DAILY ADVERTISER AND TRIBUNE, the official daily newspaper of said city, and the Michigan Daily Volksblatt, another daily newspaper published in said city.

And the Superintendent of Police of said city, or one of the Captains or Sergeants of Police under his direction, is hereby directed to serve notices of this resolution on the persons and in the manner prescribed in section three of chapter seven of the charter of said city.
