And further resolved, that the Board of Assessors of said City of Detroit, be and they are hereby directed to proceed forthwith to make an assessment roll, in conformity with the requirements of the Charter of the City of Detroit, relating to special assessments for collecting the expense of public improvements when a street is graded, comprising the property heretofore described, upon which they shall assess and levy the amount of \$4,694, each lot or parcel to be assessed a ratable proportion, as near as may be of said amount in accordance to the amount of benefit derived by such improvements.
