Gentlemen—Your Committee on Ways and Means, to whom was referred the communication from the Controller asking for an additional appropriation to meet the deficiency incurred by the Central Counting Board, respectfully report that we have had the same under consideration, and find that the total expense of the Central Counting Board for the last fall election was \$6,431.33, against which there was an appropriation of \$3,600, leaving a deficiency of \$2,831.53. Inasmuch as there are sufficient moneys saved on some of the appropriations for the primary election, and also for the general election to make up this shortage, the Controller suggests that the deficiency be made from this surplus, which recommendation is concurred in by your committee, and we therefore offer the following resolution.
