Gentlemen—Your Committee on Street Openings, to whom was re-ferred the petition of House of Good Shepherd asking for release of Good-tions imposed in the matter of condi-tion of alley, respectfully report that we have had the matter under that sideration and beg leave to state that on Feb. 13, 1906, a resolution was adopt-ed vacating the public alley in block bounded by Fort, Lafayette, Eigh-teenth and Nineteenth streets upon condition that petitioners pay into the City Treasury whatever expense may have been incurred by the City in the matter of constructing crosswalks, sidewalk, etc., and paving of Eigh-teenth street and Lafayette Boulevard in front of said alley, as may be cer-tified to by the City Engineer; that petitioners desire to be relieved of said conditions for the reason that House of Good Shepherd is a recog-nized charitable institution, having to-day 485 inmates of whom a great num-ber are very old people, and also many orphans, utterly without means and contributing nothing to their support; that the institution is dependent upon charity and heavily in debt.
