It is hereby ordained by the people of the City of Detroit:

Section 1. That an ordinance 2 entitled, "An Ordinance prescribing certain limits within the City 4 of Detroit where saloons in which 5 spirituous, intoxicating or malt spirituous, intoxicating or malt liquors are sold as a beverage shall 6 not hereafter be established and not hereafter be established and maintained and spirituous, intoxicating and malt liquors sold therein, and to repeal all ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent therewith, approved Jan. 2, 1908," be amended by adding a new section thereto to be known as section 5, which shall read as follows: 10 11 12 13 14 15 lows: 16

Sec. 5. No saloon where spirit-uous, intoxicating or malt liquors are sold as a beverage shall be hereafter established and maintain-3 ed within the territory within the City of Detroit described as follows: All that portion of the City bounded on the west by the center line of Hastings street; on the east by the center line of Hastings of Puscell street. by the center line of Russell street; on the north by a line 130 feet distant north of and parallel with the northerly line of Ferry avenue, and on the south by a line 130 feet distant south of and parallel with 13
