To the Honorable the Common Council:

Gentlemen—Your Committee on Street Openings, to whom was referred the petition of Union National Bank for adjustment of a street opening assessment levied against certain prop- erty adjoining Bellevue avenue, lying south of East Grand Boulevard, re- spectfully report that we have had the same under consideration and beg leave to state that petitioner sold out- lot 11 and part of out-lot 10 to the Packard Motor Car Company; that in the matter of the opening of Bellevue avenue street opening assessments were levied against said property; that in assessing same for the opening of Bellevue avenue, through an error on the part of the Assessors' office, the property was described in such a man- ner as to include 28 feet of the East Grand Boulevard, upon which 28 feet they paid the assessment, and excepted from the description the south 26 feet of the north 180.26 feet of out-lot

10, attempting at the time to reach certain property, part of which was condemned and the remainder not assessed for the opening because of its being (so-called) surplus property. In view of the fact that petitioner paid an assessment extending 28.30 feet into the East Grand Boulevard we recommend that the assessment levied against the south 26 feet of the north 183.26 feet be canceled, and we therefore offer the following resolution.
